

THE AGREEMENT

This articulation agreement is intended to facilitate the transfer of graduates from SUNY Cobleskill's Liberal Arts and Sciences (A.A.) degree with a Humanities Concentration to Plattsburgh State University's Elementary Education Grades 1-6 (B.S.) degree, with an English Concentration. The objectives, terms and conditions of this agreement are set forth as follows:

OBJECTIVES

1. To attract qualified students to SUNY Cobleskill and Plattsburgh State University.
2. To facilitate upward educational and career mobility in the elementary education profession.
3. To promote the efficient transfer of qualified students from SUNY Cobleskill to Plattsburgh State University.
4. To disseminate program specific information to students who wish to obtain a baccalaureate degree in elementary education.
5. To provide students with advisement in academic and career planning throughout their program of study.
6. To reduce the completion of unnecessary courses.
7. To facilitate communication and academic coordination between faculty, students and administrators at each institution.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. A graduate of SUNY Cobleskill will be accepted as a matriculated student in Plattsburgh State University's Elementary Education Grades 1-6 (B.S.) program, with the English Concentration, upon meeting the following conditions:
 - a. Application for admission to Plattsburgh State University will be the responsibility of the SUNY Cobleskill graduate.
 - b. To be eligible for admission, applicants must have achieved a minimum over-all cumulative grade point average of 2.5. Note, this is the same grade point average required of native Plattsburgh students to enter the junior year.
 - c. Plattsburgh will accept up to 67 SUNY Cobleskill transfer credits.
2. Pre-professional Skills Test (PPST): Students seeking admission into the professional education course sequence of the elementary education program must take and pass all section of the Pre-professional Skills Test (PPST). SUNY Cobleskill students should plan to complete the PPST the semester before enrolling at Plattsburgh.
3. A Bachelor of Science degree with the major in elementary education, will be awarded to the student upon meeting the following conditions:
 - a. Satisfactory completion of a minimum of 125 credits.
 - b. A minimum grade point average of 2.5.
 - c. A minimum grade point average of 2.5 in the academic concentration.
 - d. A minimum grade of "C" in all education courses.
 - e. A minimum grade of "C" in Cobleskill's ENGL102 and Plattsburgh's EDU330.

- f. Language requirement (other than English). All teacher education students must complete a two-semester, beginning-level sequence or it's equivalent, in a foreign language.
 - g. A minimum of 45 credits of upper-division, 300-400 level, courses, with 21 upper-division credits required in residence at Plattsburgh State University.
 - h. A residency requirement of 36 credits granted by Plattsburgh State University, with 18 of those 36 credits in the major department, education (EDM,EDR,EDS,EDU).
 - i. Completion of a minimum of 60 credits of liberal arts courses, required for a B.S. degree.
 - j. Completion of all necessary general education requirements.
 - k. Completion of all education requirements.
 - l. Completion of all concentration requirements.
4. SUNY Cobleskill and Plattsburgh State University will disseminate information about the articulation agreement in appropriate publications.
 5. Changes in this agreement can be made at any time by mutual consent.
 6. This agreement will remain in effect until terminated by either party. Termination would require a minimum of six months notification.




** The Cobleskill student should transfer with two courses in French or two courses in Spanish.


