## SUNY Cobleskill Faculty-Led Program

**COURSE: PSYC 310 Topics in Psychology: Applying theories of human aggression to the era of Apartheid, 3 credits.**

This academic travel course offers a rare opportunity to apply classroom learning about the causes and consequences of aggressive behavior to their real life encounters with a real example of how aggression and violence affected a nation. The course will highlight how engaging in differential behaviour affects the future relations among citizens, in South Africa as well as the rest of the world. Students will participate in pre-travel classes as well as all planned activities and tours of unique locations in Johannesburg, Pretoria, Cape Town and Kruger national park. They will also experience the diversity and wonder of South Africa's geography and wildlife. **This course fulfills an upper-level LAS requirement and a psychology advisement track requirement.**

**ELIGIBILITY:** SUNY Cobleskill students in good academic standing from any academic major. Alumni and community members welcome as space allows\*.

**PREREQUISITE:** PSYC 111 General Psychology or permission of instructor

**ESTIMATED PROGRAM COST: \$4,400-\$4,700 per participant. DOES NOT INCLUDE TUITION/INSTRUCTIONAL FEES (\$809 in-state. Out-of-state tuition additional.)** Includes group airfare from NYC, hotel accommodation, most meals, program-related travel, international health insurance, program fee, and excursions/site visits. Participants will be responsible for passport expenses, additional meals, and personal spending money. A passport is required. **\$500 deposit due upon acceptance.** Financial aid may apply. \*Alumni and Community members will pay fee differential of \$809 in lieu of tuition.
