





"Haring on Haring" was a portrait I had exhibited at The New York Historical Society at Saturday Academy, it was meant as homage to Keith Haring. The one worry I had on the test, and was not sure he would pass, was when I had to hand the leash over to someone else. Fez did not like to leave my side and he sure was not okay with leaving me and walking away with some stranger. When the day came for the evaluation I had

to drive to another town. When I walked in, I saw a lady behind a desk and an elderly lady sitting in a wheel chair. Fez shocked me with what he did next. He went right over to the lady in the wheel chair and put his head right in her lap! He passed the evaluation without any problems and with great praise from the judge. Fezzick is not only my emotional healer, but soon will bring support to others at hospitals, nursing homes, and anywhere else in the community that may need him." ~Siera Ellis







Alexis Nunez Named SUNY Cobleskill Men's Basketball Team's Most Valuable Player 5/14/2014 Press Release The SUNY Cobleskill Department of Sport & Exercise announced today that junior Alexis Nunez, White Plains, N.Y., White Plains, N.Y., has been named the men's basketball team's Most Valuable Player for the 2013-14 season. Nunez was honored with the award at the college's annual Athletic Awards Convocation.

The White Plains, N.Y. native earned Third Team All-North Eastern Athletic Conference (NEAC) Team honors this season leading the Fighting Tigers back to the NEAC Men's Basketball Championship Tournament this season as the team won eight of its last nine games to finish the season with an 11-13 overall record, the most wins since the program joined the NCAA Division III ranks in 2008.

This season in 23 appearances, including 22 starts, Nunez averaged 13.9 points, 4.2 assists, 3.2 rebounds and 1.3 steals per contest while shooting 42.5% from the field, including 33.8% from three -point range, and 76.1 % from the free throw line. Nunez led the NEAC in minutes played per game averaging 36.0 per game this year while ranking: fifth in assists, eighth in free throw percentage and eleventh in points per game.
