

## Mandatory Professional Licensure Disclosure State University of New York College of Agriculture and Technology at Cobleskill July 1, 2020

New York State prides itself in the high quality of its licensed and certified professionals. For the protection of its citizens, each license and certificate has requirements that individuals must meet in order to be licensed or certified in New York State. State University of New York's ("SUNY") academic programs leading to licensure and/or certification are carefully designed to meet and exceed the State's requirements. This is a role that SUNY plays in protecting the public. Other states frequently have their own requirements, so if your goal is to practice in another state, this disclosure will help you check to see what that state requires.

In compliance with Federal Regulations, 34 CFR §668.43 (2019 Rule), and State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (SARA) Manual version 19.2, State University of New York College of Agriculture and Technology at Cobleskill ("SUNY Cobleskill") provides the following disclosure related to the educational requirements for professional certification and/or licensure in Paramedicine.

This Disclosure is strictly limited to the SUNY Cobleskill's determination of whether its educational programs, specifically the following programs: **Paramedic, Associate in Applied Science (AAS) and Paramedic Certification** - that if successfully completed, would be sufficient to meet the educational licensure and/or certification requirements in a State for the practice of paramedicine. SUNY Cobleskill cannot provide verification of an individual's ability to meet licensure and/or certification requirements unrelated to its educational programming. Such individual determinations are made by state licensing boards, and are fact-specific determinations.

This disclosure does <u>not</u> provide any guarantee that any particular state licensure and/or certification entity will approve or deny your application. Furthermore, this disclosure does <u>not</u> account for changes in state law or regulation that may affect your application for licensure and occur after this disclosure has been made. <u>Enrolled students and prospective students are strongly encouraged to contact their State's licensure entity using the links provided to review all licensure and certification requirements imposed by their state(s) of choice.</u>
