Trip Highlights Include:

An ecological trek across the isthmus: Visit the Cloud Forest of El Valle including night hikes, Hiking in Sarigua National Park, Volcan Baru, and the rainforests of Gamboa. Enjoy a boat ride to Coiba National Park for whale watching and snorkeling, and observe the breeding grounds of threatened sea birds. Work with conservation biologists on the ground actively preserving biodiversity in these habitats.
