Campus Scholarship Policy



1. All admitted students who are awarded a Cobleskill scholarship must complete a FAFSA.
2. Cobleskill offers a variety of single year and renewable scholarships. If a Cobleskill scholarship is not specifically identified as a renewable scholarship in #3 and #4 below, then it is awarded only for the student's first year of attendance.
3. The following Cobleskill scholarships are renewable up to 4 years (2 years for Associates Degrees) as long as student maintains a minimum 2.25 GPA: Centennial, Destination, Presidential, and Presidential FFA,
4. The following Cobleskill scholarships are renewable up to 4 years (2 years for Associates Degrees) as long as student maintains a minimum 3.0 GPA: Honors, Schoharie County Valedictorian.
5. All annual scholarship awards are divided evenly between the fall and spring semesters.
6. All billed charges that are not covered by a Cobleskill Scholarship must be paid in full by the billing due date (i.e. cash, financial aid, other forms of assistance or a monthly payment plan must be in place).
7. A Cobleskill scholarship will be reduced if a student receives a total in grants and scholarships that exceeds their total billed charges for the semester.
8. All Cobleskill scholarships require full time enrollment.
9. On-campus residency is required for the Destination Scholarship and will be cancelled (removed from the bill) if student withdraws from the College or moves off campus before the end of the semester.
10. Some Cobleskill scholarships are supported by contributions from private donors. Recipients of these scholarships will be expected to complete an annual scholarship questionnaire. Students will be notified prior to the start of the school year if their scholarship is funded in part by a private contribution. If this is the case then the student will also be expected to write a thank you note to the individual donor and attend an annual scholarship luncheon.
11. All Cobleskill Scholarships are designated to provide financial assistance toward non-tuition expenses and therefore will not reduce a NYS Excelsior scholarship.
