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ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

between

and

FREEHOLD TOWNSHIP HIGH SCHOOL  
SEPTEMBER 2020 – SEPTEMBER 2025

The State University of New York College of Agriculture and Technology at Cobleskill and Freehold Township High School jointly endorse this articulation agreement impacting the Freehold Township High School graduates successfully completing the CASE Animal Science Program. It is the intent of this agreement to recognize the breadth and depth of this program as a foundation for students who matriculate at SUNY Cobleskill in a major within the Department of Animal Science. A candidate<sup>1</sup> from Freehold Township High School who:

1. Receives a New Jersey State high school diploma
2. Follows the CASE Animal Science curriculum, achieving an 85 average or higher in each course included in the above curriculum and meets all other SUNY Cobleskill admission requirements for their major
3. Has a written recommendation from the Freehold Township High School CASE Animal Science instructor

will be offered by SUNY College of Agriculture and Technology at Cobleskill, Department of Animal Science within the School of Agriculture and Natural Resources:

1. Guaranteed admission into either the Agricultural Science AAS, Animal Industry AAS, Animal Science BT or BS degrees, provided that the student meets admission requirements for the program and that there is availability within the program
2. Will receive advanced standing credit for SUNY Cobleskill's course ANSC 199 Foundations of Animal Science (3 credits)
3. Will receive advanced standing credit for SUNY Cobleskill's course AGBU 101 Introduction to Agricultural Business (3 credits)
4. Will receive advanced standing credit for SUNY Cobleskill's course ANSC 111 Introduction to Animal Science (3 credits) after the student passes the challenge exam given during the first week of classes at SUNY Cobleskill
5. Will receive advanced standing credit for SUNY Cobleskill's course BIOL 104 Animal Anatomy and Physiology (3 credits) after the student passes the challenge exam given during the first week of classes at SUNY Cobleskill

The student must complete and file a SUNY Cobleskill Admissions Application according to instructions. The letter of recommendation from the CASE Animal Science instructor must accompany the application stating the student attends this institution, which has an articulation agreement with SUNY Cobleskill.

The effective date of this agreement is September 1, 2020 and will be reviewed for renewal, five years after signing, by the participating parties.
