

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

between

STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE AND TECHNOLOGY AT COBLESKILL

and

FALL MOUNTAIN REGIONAL HIGH SCHOOL

DECEMBER 2024 – DECEMBER 2029

The State University of New York College of Agriculture and Technology at Cobleskill and Fall Mountain Regional High School jointly endorse this articulation agreement impacting graduates successfully completing the Animal Science program at Fall Mountain Regional high School. It is the intent of this agreement to recognize the breadth and depth of this program as a foundation for students who matriculate to SUNY Cobleskill. A candidate¹ from Fall Mountain Regional high School who:

- 1. Receives a New Hampshire high school diploma.
- 2. Follows the Animal Science curriculum, achieving an 85 or higher average in each course included in the above curriculum and meets all other SUNY Cobleskill admission requirements for their major.
- 3. Receives a written recommendation from the Fall Mountain Regional High School Animal Science instructor or representative.

will be offered by SUNY College of Agriculture and Technology at Cobleskill:

- 1. Guaranteed admission into SUNY Cobleskill, provided that the student meets admission requirements for the program and that there is availability within the program.
- 2. Will receive advanced standing credits for SUNY Cobleskill's course ANSC 111 Introduction to Animal Science (3 semester credits), after the student passes the challenge exam given during the first week of classes at SUNY Cobleskill
- 3. Will receive advanced standing credits for SUNY Cobleskill's course ANSC 161 Light Horse Management (3 semester credits), after the student passes the challenge exam given during the first week of classes at SUNY Cobleskill
- 4. Will receive advanced standing credits for SUNY Cobleskill's course ANSC 252 Ruminant Health (3 semester credits), after the student passes the challenge exam given during the first week of classes at SUNY Cobleskill

The student must complete and file a SUNY Cobleskill Admissions Application according to instructions. The letter of recommendation from the Animal Science instructor or Fall Mountain Regional High School representative must accompany the application stating the student attends this institution, which has an articulation agreement with SUNY Cobleskill.

In accordance with the provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"), in order for SUNY Cobleskill to share information about the student from the student's educational records. Fall Mountain Regional High School must agree not to disclose the information to a third party without the student's consent, and to use the information only for the purposes for which it was disclosed. The laws of the State of New York

shall govern this agreement without regard to conflict of law provisions. Any dispute arising under this Agreement shall be resolved in a court of competent jurisdiction in the State of New York. This Agreement contains the entire understanding of the parties with respect to the matters contained herein.

SUNY Cobleskill and Fall Mountain Regional High School agree to communicate any curriculum changes or policies, which affect the agreed-upon relationship, as soon as it is reasonably possible. Both parties reserve the right to amend or

revise this agreement. These changes must be submitted in writing and signed by both parties.

The effective date of this agreement is December 1, 2024, and will be reviewed for renewal, five years after signing, by the participating parties.

Persons not meeting these criteria have the option of applying to SUNY Cobleskill under regular admission procedure.
