

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

between

STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK  
COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE AND TECHNOLOGY AT COBLESKILL  
and  
CHARLES W. BAKER HIGH SCHOOL

JUNE 2022 – JUNE 2027

The State University of New York College of Agriculture and Technology at Cobleskill and Charles W. Baker High School jointly endorse this articulation agreement impacting the graduates successfully completing the Culinary Arts program. It is the intent of this agreement to recognize the breadth and depth of this program as a foundation for students who matriculate at SUNY Cobleskill as a Culinary Arts major within the Business, Food Service and Agricultural Management Department. A candidate<sup>1</sup> from Charles W. Baker High School who:

1. Receives a New York State high school diploma
2. Follows the Charles W. Baker High School Culinary Arts curriculum, achieving an 85 or higher average in each course included in the above curriculum and meets all other SUNY Cobleskill admission requirements for their major
3. Receives a written recommendation from the Charles W. Baker High School Culinary Arts instructor

will be offered by SUNY College of Agriculture and Technology at Cobleskill, Department of Business, Food Service and Agricultural Management:

1. Guaranteed admission into a Culinary Arts program, provided that the student meets admission requirements for the program and that there is availability within the program
2. Will receive advanced standing credit for SUNY Cobleskill's course CAHT 111 Culinary 1 (3 semester credits)
3. Will receive advanced standing credit for SUNY Cobleskill's course CAHT 103 Food Service Sanitation (2 semester credits), if the student has a valid ServSafe Food Manager Certificate
4. Will receive advanced standing credit for SUNY Cobleskill's course CAHT 140 Mathematics Hospitality Operations (3 semester credits) after the student earns a 75% on the Math Challenge exam given the first week of classes at SUNY Cobleskill

The student must complete and file a SUNY Cobleskill Admissions Application according to instructions. The letter of recommendation from the Charles W. Baker High School Culinary Arts instructor must accompany the application stating the student attends this institution, which has an articulation agreement with SUNY Cobleskill.

The effective date of this agreement is June 1, 2022, and will be reviewed for renewal, five years after signing, by the participating parties.






