



**Transfer Articulation Agreement
between
STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK
COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE AND TECHNOLOGY AT COBLESKILL
and
FULTON-MONTGOMERY COMMUNITY COLLEGE**

September 2015

This agreement establishes procedures to promote the easy transition of Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree graduates in Early Childhood from Fulton-Montgomery Community College (FM) to the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in Early Childhood Studies: Birth to Age 5 at the State University of New York College of Agriculture and Technology at Cobleskill (SUNY Cobleskill).

Objectives of the Agreement

1. To provide a transfer path to qualified FM graduates who want to enhance their education and careers by pursuing a bachelor's degree.
2. To assist academic advisors with pertinent academic information for students who wish to continue their education in a bachelor degree program.
3. To attract qualified students to FM and SUNY Cobleskill.
4. To facilitate communication and academic coordination between faculty and administrators at each institution regarding curriculum and the transferability of courses.

Terms of the Agreement

1. Students from FM who have completed the A.A.S. degree in Early Childhood and the courses outlined in the addendum, with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average, will be guaranteed admission into the B.S. Early Childhood Studies: Birth to Age 5 program at SUNY Cobleskill with full junior status.
2. Transfer students must complete and file the SUNY Admissions Application indicating transfer to SUNY Cobleskill prior to November 1 for spring semester entry, and prior to May 15 for fall semester entry.
3. Major field and advisement track courses with grades of C or better and ENG 101 with a C- or better will be accepted for transfer credit.
4. Students who do not meet the requirements of this agreement will also be considered for admission. They will be evaluated on an individual basis.

Review and Revision of the Agreement

This agreement will be reviewed when substantial changes are made in the curriculum on either campus. At the request of either party, a review of the Transfer Articulation Agreement will be conducted by both institutions.


Termination






